Doosan Forklift Part - Doosan Infracore Company Ltd. is an international organization consisting of Diesel Engines, Defense Industry goods, Industrial Vehicles, Construction Equipment and Machine Tools and Mechanization Systems.

In the U.S.A., Doosan Infracore America Corporation is headquartered in Suwanee, Georgia. It is home to a 170,000 square foot production facility, which is the home of the Compact Equipment and Construction department. West Caldwell, New Jersey is home to the Machine Tool division and Cleveland, Ohio is home to the Lift truck division. The U.S. headquarters in Georgia facilitates a first rate parts operation capable of supplying an excess of 25,000 line items to support Lift Truck, Compact Equipment, Machine Tool and Construction consumer needs.

With a system consisting of over 90 independent dealers, the forklift group supplies quality materials handling equipment to the broad North American marketplace. Doosan Infracore America Forklift dealers successfully operate in over 220 service and sales locations throughout Canada and the U.S. The lift truck product line remarkably includes 63 distinctive machines consisting of 82 various battery and engine configurations of Electric-powered and Internal Combustion lift trucks. Capacities of these numerous truck versions range from 3,000 to 33,000 lbs. All vehicles are built in an ISO 9001 qualified facility.

Doosan Infracore America is the fastest expanding forklift company in the North American market, due to their stability in retaining a high level of consumer service quality and optimum product functioning to all Doosan Infracore Forklift users. The U.S. lift Truck division based in Cleveland has a professional team experienced in Product Sales, Purchasing, Marketing, Logistical and Technical Support.

At first the home-based forklift marketplace in Korea was an open import enterprise. Korea Machinery Co. Ltd. begun in 1960, to import fully assembled lift trucks as part of a domestic equipment expansion venture. Product sales of these products were primarily targeted to state-run companies, large scale organizations, and the armed forces. This eventually led to a merger with Daewoo Heavy Industries Ltd. In 1976, the Forklift Division commenced trade operations throughout Korea to overhaul and sell this heavy equipment. By 1978, a lift truck manufacturing plant was successfully completed. Continuous technical training became the new focus for improving quality and product development.

Home-based lift truck trade for Daewoo started in 1967 and grew to an astounding 90% market share in Korea. By the 1980's, Daewoo's advanced technological enhancements combined with sales success placed them in a position of significant expansion of their forklift operations.

In 1981, Caterpillar Industrial Inc. of the United States, proposed a joint venture project to respond to competitive pressures in the US materials handling industry. This venture radically expanded Daewoo's forklift sales. Construction was finished in 1984 to facilitate a new plant which helped establish the company for the fabrication of high added-value products suited for export. In 1993, the company had a global sales network and started exporting models they had established through in-house expertise, as an independent product. Certifications were then acquired from CE of Europe, UL of the United States and ISO 14001 and ISO 9001, securing expansion possibilities into international markets.
